We encourage applications from students with disabilities and specific learning difficulties, our aim is to enable all students to undertake and complete their studies successfully.

We advise you to disclose relevant information concerning additional needs arising from any disability, health-related condition or specific learning difficulty. Telling us about your needs allows us to consider what adjustments might need to be made to ensure your needs are met. Any information you divulge to the team is treated as confidential.
